New Membership Year Approaching Fast

It is almost the end of the 2023-24 FFA year. All membership ends officially on July 31, 2024. The new year technically begins on August 1, 2024 but it Is usually right around September 1, 2024 before local chapters and state associations are given access to the roster information. In the month of August, the following happens at National FFA. 1. Any local chapters who did not pay their annual fee for 2023-24 are deactivated and they are notified that they can no longer do business as an FFA Alumni and use the FFA name and brand, unless they apply to reactivate. 2. The other thing that happens is national FFA automatically renews all of the associate members, which are the graduates from 55 who get free benefits as associate members for up to 5 years. Those associate members do have the option to become annual or lifetime members at any point in the five years. 3. Also, during August, all of the lifetime members are automatically renewed. So, when membership opens for the local level, all that needs to be added is the annual members.

This is where we have noticed an issue developing at many of the local chapters. In order to process your local roster, national FFA requires chapters to first pay their annual fee. We are excited to announce that we again will be offering the early bird discount, so if chapters pay by October 1, 2024, they can subtract a \$ 50 discount and pay \$ 250 rather than \$ 300. We have been offering this discount the past couple of years in order to get local chapters to get their annual members on the rosters and as active as possible early. However, we are seeing many chapters are paying fees, but not adding members to the roster.

This means that the annual members are not receiving newsletters and other state or national communications. (Note, many are not checking profiles also, so emails are not listed or accurate, so they are not in touch either) Plus, there are so many awesome benefits for local members now like hotel discounts, restaurant discounts, dodge rebates, travel opportunities and more, we would love to have everyone get on the roster in October. We encourage the local annual members to

follow up with their local chapter leaders, who will receive directions and an invoice in early September, to make sure you are on the roster.

2025 Convention Planning Under Way

The 2025 convention committee is hard at work finalizing the details for the upcoming convention which will be held on February 7 -8, 2025 at the Holiday Inn and Convention and Expo Center at Stevens Point. The committee is actually set to meet again on Saturday, August 10 at 10 AM at the actual convention site. There will also be a zoom option as well at 10:30 AM after the facility tour.
